YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY

Pre-requisites: Proof of 2 completed, prepare to discuss 3, watch or read news for 5 days, prepare to present 6, proof of 8 completed (copy of letter)

Citizenship in the World Merit Badge

YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY
M401

Citizens in democratic societies have the responsibility not only to obey the law, but also to be informed. Learn how to be a good citizen of our world. Learn how to understand and appreciate the values, traditions and concerns of people in other countries.

Pre-requisites: 7. This class is for 2 periods.

Coin Collecting Merit Badge

Understand how coins are made, and where the active U.S. mint facilities are located

Pre-requisite - Bring a coin set of each denomination.

Electronics Merit Badge

YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY
M403

Describe the safety precautions you must exercise when using, building, altering, or repairing electronic devices.

Emergency Preparedness Merit Badge

YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY
M404

This will test your planning skills in the face of unexpected disasters. After all, a scout must be prepared for anything! In earning this badge **you'll learn useful rescue techniques, understand the history behind disaster preparedness, and prepare your own household for a potential emergency.**

Pre-requisites: First Aid merit badge, 2B, 7B and 9A

Fingerprinting Merit Badge

YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY
M405

Learn about and use an important technique used by law enforcement officers. **Pre-requisites: None.**

Law Merit Badge

YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY
M406

Earning this merit badge enables a Scout to learn about the history and kinds of laws, the purpose and methods of law enforcement, consumer protection agencies, emerging law, and careers in the legal profession. **Pre-requisites: 4, 6. This class is for 3 periods**

Scouting Heritage Merit Badge

Learn about the history of Scouting. **Pre-requisites: None.**

Search and Rescue Merit Badge

YOUTH AGE 11-17 ONLY
M408

NOT ALL WHO wander are lost. But some are. Assisting the lost and confused is the aim of the Search and Rescue merit badge, one of the newest merit badges. Developed by SAR professionals and Philmont Scout Ranch veterans, the badge shows Scouts how to find search subjects, bring them to safety and avoid becoming lost themselves.
